Event Description:-

- The Inaugural session started on the topic **that** Hinduism embraces three ways to achieve Moksha: **jnana, bhakti, and karma**. The jnana way, or Jnana Marga, is the way of attaining Moksha through knowledge and study. Mr. Sudhir Kumar enlightened the students.
- All students actively participated in the event.
- Mr. Sudhir Kumar started the discussion with the students sharing their views on three ways to find Moksha, i.e., Gyan, karma, and bhakti. Though these paths, known as yogas,

focus on different aspects of human life, such as gyan yoga on knowledge, karma yoga on work, and bhakti yoga on love and devotion, all these means of spiritual upliftment seek the same goal, i.e., the liberation of the soul. Path of Gita is the path of freedom which leads from darkness to light and from a limited existence to limitlessness.

- He said that depression is mann ka rog, and he also talked about how sympathy leads to Seva with the example of an American photographer.
- He also talked about human trafficking is rising day by day and how to control it in society. He said it is the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harbouring, or receipt of people through force, fraud, or deception, with the aim of exploiting them for profit. Men, women, and children of all ages and backgrounds can become victims of this crime, which occurs in every region of the world.
- He also shared about Smile Scheme for Transgender, which provides Scholarships for Transgender Students studying in IX till post-graduation to enable them to complete their education.
- The session ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Akhilesh Tripathi. All students enthusiastically participated in it.
